The 2015 Impact factors have been released and ISID is pleased to announce that the new IF for the *IJID* is 2.229 (©Thompson Scientific Journal Citation Reports 2016), an increase from 1.859 in 2014. IJID is now ranked at 48/83 in the Thomson Reuters Infectious Diseases category a move from 56/78.

Longitude Prize

For Global Innovation in Developing Diagnostic Tools to Combat Anti Microbial Resistance

The Longitude Prize - a five year, £10m challenge to tackle the global threat of antimicrobial resistance has launched a new seed funding program to support new and existing teams taking part in the Longitude Prize, to broaden the range of innovations and applications from innovators worldwide.

The Longitude Discovery Award will provide grants of up to £25,000 to participants who need access to funding in order to develop their ideas on transformative, novel point-of-care diagnostics that could significantly reduce the misuse or overuse of antibiotics globally.

The £10 million Longitude Prize fund itself will be awarded for the 'winning' entrant to develop a diagnostic test for bacterial infections that is accurate, rapid, affordable and easy-to-use anywhere in the world. The challenge is open for five years

ISID and Pfizer's goal is to decrease health disparities by increasing access to or use of vaccinations by adults either individually or by population in low- and middle-income countries.

<u>Bruce Y. Lee</u> of the International Vaccine Access Center (IVAC) and Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health was granted an award for his project, *Strategic Immunization Geo-temporal Mapping Application (SIGMA)*, and has recently published an article in Vaccine.


